

Rules of the Show

- 1. All exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor and must have been in his/her possession for at least two months.
- The Committee reserves the right to inspect the gardens or allotments of all Exhibitors one week before the date of the Show. All entries both paper and online to be in by Monday 8th July 2024. No entries after this date or on the show day will be accepted.
- 3. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry or exhibit and, in the event of such right being exercised, the Committee is not required to give any reason or explanation.
- 4. Any objection must be made in writing to one of the Committee not later than 4.30 pm on the day of the Show.
- 5. Exhibitors must supply their own plates, vases etc. Exhibits may be staged from 8.00 am on the day of the Show. No exhibit may be staged after 10.00 am and must remain staged until 5.00 pm, unless otherwise authorised by the Chairman. Judging will commence at 10.00 am and no person may be in the marquee when this takes place, unless in an official capacity.
- 6. Horticultural Classes will be judged according to the rules and standards contained in the Royal Horticultural Show handbook 2016 (available from the Committee), except where, under this schedule, they obviously do not apply. Numbers of vegetables and fruit are as listed on Page 15 unless otherwise specified in the section. In the event of close competition, the naming of varieties and arrangement of entries will be taken into account.
- 7. The Judges' decision will be final.
- 8. No Exhibitor may have more than one entry in any one class.
- 9. Entries, other than pot plants, must not have been previously exhibited at the Chipstead Village Flower Show and Fair.
- 10. In Classes where only one entry is received, a First Prize shall not necessarily be given but it shall be left to the Judges to award a prize according to the standard of the exhibit.
- 11. Trophies and children's vouchers will be presented at 4.30 pm. Any prizes not collected will be held by one of the Committee for collection, and if not collected within one month will be treated as a contribution to funds. Trophy winners will also receive a certificate in the coming weeks after the show. NOTE: Trophies are no longer engraved. All trophies awarded in 2024 must be returned to Mrs Rosine Traisneau, 22 Portnalls Rise, Coulsdon, CR5 3DA, Tel: 01737 556575 not later than 30th June 2025.
- 12. The Committee will take all reasonable care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. They will not be responsible for any accident arising from any cause whatsoever to any person assisting, exhibiting or visiting the show, or for any loss or damage howsoever caused to the property of any person.
- 13. No dogs or smoking allowed in the Show Marquee.
- 14. FOR SCHOOLS ONLY Entries in Sections F and G should be made based on the age of the child when the work was completed. Please date the entries.
- Entry forms WILL NOT be accepted via our email address only via the online entry form or the form printed in this schedule and delivered to Mrs R.Selfe. Chesterwood, 1, Hollymead Road, Chipstead.



RECIPES FOR SECTION "D"

Onion, Port & Thyme Marmalade (Page 26)

1 kilo onions (peeled and halved), 4 tablespoons of olive oil, 1 teaspoon sea salt, 2 teaspoons chopped fresh thyme leaves, 110 grams dark brown sugar, 3 tablespoons balsamic vinegar, 3 tablespoons white wine vinegar, 2 tablespoons port, 2 tablespoons redcurrant jelly, freshly ground pepper.

Method:

Finely slice the onions. Heat the oil in a large pan, then add the onions, salt and thyme and soften gently, stirring occasionally for 35-40 minutes. Once the onions are soft, add all the remaining ingredients, plus a good grind of black pepper, and bring slowly to the boil. Cook for a further 10 minutes or so stirring occasionally, until most of the liquid has evaporated. Spoon into warm sterilised jars and seal.

Poppy & Sesame Seed Crackers (Page 26)

250g plain flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, ½ teaspoon sea salt, 2 tablespoons poppy seeds, 2 tablespoons sesame seeds, 1 teaspoon black pepper, 60 grams butter (cold and chopped).

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas 4. Line two baking sheets with baking paper. Sift the flour, baking powder and salt into a bowl, then stir in the seeds and pepper. Using your fingertips, rub in the butter until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Make a well in the centre, then add 100ml iced water. Using a flat-bladed knife at first and then your hands, mix until a firm dough forms, adding more iced water if necessary. Don't over mix! Form the dough into a rough ball, then cut in half. Wrap one half in cling film and chill in the fridge. Roll the other half out between two sheets of baking paper until 1-2mm thick. Using a lightly floured 6cm round cutter, cut out rounds. Place on a baking sheet and prick all over with a fork. Repeat with the rest of the dough. Chill for 20 minutes. Bake for 20-35 minutes until lightly golden. Move to a wire rack to cool.

Marshmallow Balls (Page 26)

A 1 packet large marshmallows, 2 tablespoons drinking chocolate, ½ can condensed milk, 225 grams digestive biscuits, 50 grams butter or margarine, chocolate sugar strands e.g. vermicelli.

Method:

Crush the biscuits in a plastic bag with a rolling pin until very small, this means no lumps left! Melt the butter, condensed milk and drinking chocolate in a saucepan, when melted remove from the heat. Use a wooden spoon to stir, add the biscuits, mix together. Take a marshmallow and a ball, the size of a walnut, of the biscuit mixture and wrap it around the marshmallow. Pour the chocolate strands into a small bowl and place the balls in the bowl and shake until completely covered.

Semolina, Marmalade and Orange Blossom Cake (Page 26)

180ml sunflower oil, 240ml orange juice, 160 grams orange marmalade (fine cut or without peel), 4 medium free range eggs, grated zest of 1 orange, 70 grams caster sugar, 90 grams plain flour, 180 grams semolina, 2 tablespoons ground almonds, 2 teaspoons baking powder, thick Greek yoghurt. Soaking syrup: 200 grams of caster sugar, 140ml water, 1 tablespoon orange blossom water, plus a little for the yoghurt.

Method:

Preheat the oven 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas 4. Whisk together the oil, orange juice, marmalade, eggs and orange zest until marmalade dissolves. Mix together the dry ingredients and add to the wet. Grease and line two 500 gram loaf tins. Divide the mixture between the two and cook for 45-60 minutes. Near the end of cooking time add syrup ingredients together in a pan and bring to the boil. Brush cakes with hot syrup as soon as they come out of the oven, use all the syrup. Cool cakes, remove from the tins and serve with yoghurt flavoured with orange blossom water.


