FAQs

Where and when, will the show be held?

The show will be held on Saturday 18 July, at Elmore, High Road, Chipstead, CR5 3SB, just opposite the village pond. Gates open at 12pm.

Is parking available?

Yes, there is free parking on Chipstead Meads Recreation Gound, with a designated area for disabled visitors near the clubhouse.

Is there an entry fee?

Yes, tickets are priced at: 18 years and over: £7.50; Under 18: £5; Under 5: free. Tickets can be purchased on the day at the entrance. Card payments are accepted.

Is the event wheelchair accessible?

Yes, the showground is wheelchair-friendly, with accessible toilets and parking available.

Can I bring my dog?

Well-behaved dogs on leads are welcome, except in competition areas and the food court.

What kind of stalls will be there?

The show features a variety of stalls, including plant sales, local crafts and food vendors.

How do I enter a competition?

Competition entries can be submitted online via our website at chipsteadflowershow.co.uk or by post in a sealed envelope to: Rosemary Selfe, 1 Hollymead Road, Chipstead, CR5 3LQ, no later than Friday 10 July, 2026 after which date entries will not be accepted. Please note that once you have placed your online entry/entries, you will receive a confirmation email. If you do NOT receive a confirmation email, please contact us. Please check your spam/junk folder too! Garden Competition entries are required to be submitted by Friday 3 July, 2026.

Is there an entry fee for competitions?

No, competitions are free to enter.

How can I book a stall at the show?

If you are a stallholder and wish to apply for a stall at the show, please email us at: business@chipsteadflowershow.co.uk

What happens to the money after the show?

Any profit is used to fund the following year's event. In some years, poor weather reduces attendance and can result in a loss, as costs for the marquee, other equipment or goods must be purchased in advance. When a surplus is achieved, the Association may make one-off donations to local groups and charities following the relevant AGM. Any donations will be made only where financial viability is maintained and future shows remain sustainable, including the ability to withstand unforeseen events.

Chipstead and the RHS



Once again we are proud to be affiliated with the Royal Horticultural Society.

RHS membership has a long heritage, with the first regional gardening groups connecting with the Horticultural Society of London (now the RHS) 150 years ago. This was initiated by Sir Charles Wentworth Dilke who put forward a plan for there to be a union between the RHS and the various provincial societies.

During wartime Britain, more groups joined (especially those involved with wartime food production) and today there are 2,500 societies across the UK and overseas who are all actively championing the benefits of gardening in their communities, helping more people to develop a love of plants and being outdoors.

CLASS NWT First prize: £25. Second prize: £15. Third prize: £10. A display of eight or less cut flowers of any one variety and five kinds of vegetables, in a pot or vase, not exceeding 20cm diameter. Arranged in a space not exceeding 120cm in width.
Winner in 2025: Wendy Bedford

🏆 The Mrs M.I. Wates Trophy
MIWT Awarded to an exhibit of outstanding merit in Sections A or B.

CLASS 1 A plate of five potatoes, white or coloured (one named variety).

CLASS 2 One variety of any greenhouse grown vegetable or fruit. Number specified on page 19.

CLASS 3 Two cabbages, with stalks not less than 7.5cm long. No roots.

CLASS 4 Three carrots of any one variety, with 7.5cm tops.

CLASS 5 One of your most outstanding vegetables or fruit (please name). Foliage trimmed to approx 7.5cm.

CLASS 6 Four cylindrical or globe beetroot (named). Foliage trimmed to approx 7.5cm.

CLASS 7 Five onions grown from set, trimmed but *not skinned*.

CLASS 8 Nine bean pods, all of one kind.

CLASS 9 Three cucumbers.

CLASS 12 Two whole lettuces, with stalks. Any variety.

CLASS 13 A selection of small, medium or large tomatoes. They must be ripe but firm with green calyx attached. See RHS guidelines on page 19 for numbers.

CLASS 14 Three courgettes. Long approx 15cm length, round cultivars approx 7.5cm diameter. Show flowers if possible.

🏆 The Forsberg Compost Trophy
CLASS FCT A seed tray of sieved homemade compost.
Winner in 2025: Ian Dyke

CLASS 15 A plate of 12 salad onions.

CLASS 16 A salad plate to include one cucumber, one lettuce and five radishes.

CLASS 17 Nine pods of peas of uniform size, showing flowers if possible.

CLASS 18 Nine pods of mangetout or sugarsnap peas of uniform size, showing flowers if possible.

CLASS 19 Four named culinary herbs, one sprig of each named, shown in individual containers.

CLASS 20 Twenty raspberries, with stalks, on a plate.

CLASS 21 Soft, outdoor fruit (not raspberries or blackcurrants) to be shown with sprigs/stalks. Number specified on page 19.

🏆 The Len Jarrad Trophy
CLASS LJT Collection of three different kinds of outdoor fruit (red, black and white currants acceptable) on different plates. To be shown with sprigs/stalks. Number specified on page 19.

🏆 The Flower Show Trophy/Jubilee Cup
FST Awarded to an exhibit of outstanding merit in Classes 1–21.
Winner in 2025: Stuart Boyd

SECTION B

Flowers and pot plants



All entries are judged on quality, not the artistic display and should be displayed clean with no soil. It is permissible to stand produce in water if the weather is hot. Non-specified additions to the entry e.g. seed heads may be marked down.

CLASS 22 Two specimen roses of different varieties exhibited separately in water.

The Worley Trophy

CLASS WT Two stems of floribunda or cluster roses in a container with water.

CLASS 23 One Cactus or other succulent plant, single plant in pot.

CLASS 24 One specimen flower (not rose) with foliage. No buds and please label.

CLASS 25 Vase of six stems of 'Lavandula' (Lavender).

CLASS 26 Six fuchsia flower heads to be displayed on a plate of your choice.

CLASS 27 One potted Pelargonium / Geranium, can be ivy leafed.

CLASS 28 One potted tuberous or fibrous 'Begonia'.

CLASS 29 Five pansy / viola flowers to be shown on a plate.

CLASS 30 One potted foliage plant.

The Roger Martin Cup

CLASS RMC Vase of three 'Dahlia' blooms of the same species, named, to include some foliage but no buds.

Winner in 2025: Ralph Bedford

CLASS 31 One vase of annual 'Lathyrus' (Sweet Peas).

The Raymond Price Trophy

CLASS RPT Container of 6 similar blooms, not annual Lathyrus.

CLASS 32 One potted Hosta.

CLASS 33 Container of cut flowering shrubs.

CLASS 34 Container of cut perennial flowers, not shrubs.

CLASS 35 One hanging display of mixed plants in a container not smaller than 37cm diameter. Stand will be provided.

CLASS 36 One potted fuchsia, trailing or standard in a pot.

CLASS 37 One vase of foliage not less than four different examples.



CLASS 38 Three types of flowers in separate vases.

CLASS 39 A vase of grasses.

Recipes

Espresso coffee cake

Ingredients: 175g unsalted butter. 175g caster sugar. 3 med eggs. 175g self raising flour. 1 tsp baking powder. 1 tbsp coffee liqueur. 3 tbsp expresso coffee. For the icing: 175g golden caster sugar. 2 tbsp strong coffee dissolved in 1tbsp boiling water. Chocolate coffee beans or similar for decoration.

Method: Pre-heat oven to 190°C / 170°C fan. Grease a 900g/2lb loaf tin and line with parchment or a liner. Cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, mix the baking powder with the flour and fold into the creamed mixture, fold in the liqueur. Halve the mixture and fold the coffee into one half. Spoon some of each mixture alternately into the prepared tin. Repeat to create layers, and shake the tin to level. Use a skewer to drag through the mixture for a marbled effect. Bake for 45–50 mins. Cool, ice, decorate.

Carrot, Apple & Sultana Muffins

Ingredients: 175g self-raising flour. 1 tsp each ground ginger and cinnamon and bicarbonate of soda, 100g light brown sugar, 3 tbsp golden syrup, 150ml sunflower oil. 50g apple, peeled, and grated. 150g carrots, grated. 2 eggs. 70 g sultanas.

Method: Pre-heat oven to 190°C / 170°C fan. Line a muffin tin with 12 cases. Mix the flour, spices, bicarb, and sugar. Combine the oil, syrup and eggs and pour into the dry mix. Whisk until smooth. Stir in the carrot, apple and sultanas. Divide the batter into the muffin cases three quarters of the way up. Bake for 20–22 mins.

Biscotti

Ingredients: 300g plain flour. 100g caster sugar. 50g light brown sugar. 1½ tsp baking powder. 80g vegetable oil. 1 large egg. 2 tsp vanilla extract. Pinch salt. Flavouring.

Method: Pre-heat oven to 180°C / 160°C fan. Line a baking sheet. Stir the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt together in a bowl. In a separate bowl whisk the oil, egg and vanilla extract with 3 tbsp hot water (you could add flavouring at this point – no more than 25–50 g). Mix the 2 bowls together to form a dough. Gently knead the dough for a few minutes until smooth, adding another 1 tbsp water if necessary. Divide into two and shape into two 25 x 8 cm pieces. Place on a prepared baking sheet and cook for 25 minutes. Cool for 15 minutes, then slice 1–2 cm crosswise, replace on the baking sheet and cook for another 15–20 minutes. Cool and store in a tin.

How to make salt dough

(you could halve the recipe if you want).

Ingredients: 250g plain flour. 125g table salt. 125ml water

Method: Preheat the oven to 50°C or its lowest setting and line a baking sheet with baking parchment. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and stir until it comes together into a ball. You can finish bringing it together with your

A brief history of the event

The Chipstead Village Flower Show and Fair is a remarkable combination of two events that have been celebrated in Chipstead Village for 115 years.

'Chipstead' is most likely a corruption of 'ceapstede', a place where a market existed and is first mentioned in AD579. The first reference to a fair, rather than a market, is in 1549, when a fair was held on 20 July - St Margaret's day. It seems, however, that the fair was the scene of some notoriety that offended Victorian tastes and in 1854 the local gentry banded together to have it successfully 'suppressed' by Reigate Police. By the late 19th century a Flower Show once again was being held locally, alternating between Chipstead, Chaldon, Merstham and Mugswell. In 1910 the Flower Show was held in Chipstead (probably at Elmore) and has taken place annually in the village ever since.
